Owned and operated by the Hope and Area Transition Society, this 8-bed facility provides free accommodation and support services to women with or without their children who are fleeing an abusive environment. The facility is staffed 24 hours.

The society responds to abuse of women in relationships by providing shelter, support and counselling. It also operates a drug and alcohol outpatient clinic with prevention and intervention services, community programs such as Stopping the Violence, Children Who Witness Abuse and offers school-based programs as well. Programs and services are available to women from any community including Boston Bar, North Bend, Spuzzum, Yale, Dogwood Valley, Hope, Sunshine Valley, Manning Park, Silver Creek, Laidlaw, Bridal Falls, Popkum, Rosedale, Agassiz, Harrison Hot Springs and Harrison Mills.
