ACCEPTED IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENTS FOR ELECTOR REGISTRATION

Every elector must provide **2 pieces** of ID, at least one of which contains a signature. Picture identification is not necessary.

<u>Resident Electors</u>: should provide proof of identity *and* residency. If the elector does not have ID showing residency, they must still provide ID, one with a signature, and must make a solemn declaration of residency. Proof of *residency* should be current.

<u>Non-Resident Property Electors</u> must provide 2 pieces of ID proving identity, one with a signature; provide proof that they are entitled to register in relation to a property (that they are a current registered owner on the title and have owned the property for at least 30 days – ie current tax notice, certificate of title or title search; and, if applicable, provide written consent from the other property owners to vote on behalf of that property.

Identification that will be accepted at the FVRD Voting Locations are:

- (a) a British Columbia Driver's License,
- (b) a British Columbia Identification Card issued by the Motor Vehicle Branch,
- (c) an Owner's Certificate of Insurance and Vehicle Insurance issued by the Insurance Corporation of British Columbia,
- (d) a British Columbia Services Care,
- (e) a Ministry of Social Development and Economic Security Request for Continued Assistance Form SDES8,
- (f) a Social Insurance Card issued by Human Resources Development Canada,
- (g) a Citizenship Card issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada,
- (h) a real property tax notice
- (i) a credit card or debit card issued by a savings institution
- (j) a utility bill issued for the supply of electricity, natural gas, water, telephone services or coaxial cable services by
 - (i) a public utility as defined in section 1 of the *Utilities Commission Act*,
 - (ii) a gas utility as defined in section 1 of the Gas Utility Act,
 - (iii) a water utility as defined in section 1 of the Water Act,
 - (iv) the British Columbia Hydro and Power Authority, or
 - (v) a corporation licensed by the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission for the purpose of that supply.
- (k) Canadian Passport
- (I) Canadian Indian Status Card
- (m) Canadian Firearms License
- (n) Canadian COVID Vaccine Passport
