GUIDELINES FOR SCRUTINEERS

1. The role of Scrutineers at the voting place is to **observe** the conduct of voting and the ballot count.
2. Scrutineers cannot be appointed or act as Election Officials.
3. Scrutineers must be appointed in writing by the Chief Election Officer and must bring these appointments to the voting place.
4. Only one (1) Scrutineer for the question and one (1) Scrutineer against the question will be appointed.
5. In order to attend the voting place, Scrutineers must make a solemn declaration that they will preserve the secrecy of the ballot and will not interfere with election proceedings.
6. Scrutineers must situate themselves at all times at the location within the Voting Place as designated by the Election Officials.
7. Scrutineers are not permitted to wear anything that advertises support either 'for' or 'against' the question at the voting place or within 100m of the voting place.
8. Communication between Scrutineers and Election Officials should only occur when no voters are present at the voting place, unless the Scrutineer is officially objecting to a ballot being cast or challenging an elector.
9. Voting Books are not open to public inspection or inspection of Scrutineers at the time of voting. To make a challenge of an elector, the challenge must be conducted on the basis that the challenger recognizes the elector and believes that the elector is not qualified to vote. Voting Books are open to public inspection for 30 days after the declaration of election results.
10. Scrutineers assigned to observe the ballot count must be inside the voting place prior to the close of voting at 8:00 p.m. If they fail to attend the voting place prior to this time, the Scrutineer will not be permitted entry. Scrutineers attending the voting place for the ballot count will not be permitted to leave until the ballot count is completed.
11. Scrutineers are permitted to observe the count only and are not permitted to handle ballots or other election materials.
12. Scrutineers may object to the acceptance or rejection of a ballot but are not otherwise permitted to interfere with counting.
