We are seeking a motivated and independent individual to join our team as a full-time Park Technician II. Reporting to the Manager of Parks, this position supports conservation, maintenance, and effective operation of regional parks and trails. Activities will include providing project management, assistance, and support to the Parks staff as well as to contractors and volunteers in the field; inspecting parks, facilities and services; implementing effective preventative maintenance programs and undertaking general facilities maintenance; communicating professionally with partner organizations and other agencies; assisting with park and outdoor recreation policies and management plans; and participating in evaluation and planning of new and future trails and parks.

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- » Must have completed college or university with a diploma or degree in fish, wildlife and recreation or related discipline plus a minimum 4 years' experience in the field, or an equivalent combination of education and experience;
- » WCB Level 1 First Aid and WHMIS certification;
- » Power Saw Operation Safety and Maintenance certification;
- » Excellent computer skills, with a high level of proficiency with Microsoft Office including PowerPoint and the ability to acquire a sound knowledge of GIS, graphics and desktop publishing software and electronic filing software;
- » Familiarity with all types of maps, air photographs (stereoscopy) and map catalogues;
- » Must acquire a sound knowledge of relevant legislation, Provincial statutes and regulations;
- » Thorough understanding of safety policies and procedures and the ability to direct others in an emergency;
- » Excellent knowledge of the vegetation and wildlife of the Fraser Valley;
- » Strong knowledge of local community interest groups and their respective issues;
- » Excellent writing skills, with the ability to write in a clear and concise manner, and to prepare well written reports;
- » Strong communication and interpersonal skills, including the ability to express thoughts and ideas clearly, and converse with a wide range of people including consultants, elected officials, senior staff, and parks staff to provide advice, make recommendations and make effective presentations; and
- » Must possess a valid Driver's Licence.

The job rate for this full-time Union position is \$43.45 per hour plus a competitive and comprehensive health, dental, and vision package, and enrollment in the Municipal Pension Plan.
